

Dr. Atul Malhotra is Research Chief of Pulmonary, Critical Care and Sleep Medicine at UC San Diego. He is the Peter C. Farrell Presidential Chair and tenured Professor of Respiratory Medicine. He was recently President of the American Thoracic Society. He runs a large NIH funded laboratory focused on applied physiology of respiratory disease including sleep apnea. He has published over 350 original plus 250 reviews/chapters since coming on faculty in 2000.

Before joining UC San Diego Health, Dr. Malhotra practiced pulmonary, critical care and sleep medicine at Massachusetts General Hospital, Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center and Brigham and Women's Hospital. He also served as attending physician in intensive care at King Faisal Hospital in Rwanda. He was associate professor at Harvard Medical School and medical director of the Brigham and Women's Hospital Sleep Disorders Research Program.

Dr. Malhotra completed his fellowship training in pulmonary and critical care medicine at Harvard Medical School and a residency in internal medicine at the Mayo Clinic.
