Madeleine Grigg-Damberger, MD, is a Professor of Neurology at the University of New Mexico School of Medicine, where she also serves as Vice Chair of Neurology Faculty Development and Mentoring, Associate Director of the Clinical Neurophysiology Laboratory, and Associate Program Director of the Clinical Neurophysiology Fellowship. She earned her medical degree from Loyola University Chicago Stritch School of Medicine, completed her neurology residency at Boston University, and pursued a post-doctoral fellowship in EEG and epilepsy at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Grigg-Damberger is board certified in Neurology, Clinical Neurophysiology, Sleep Medicine, and Epilepsy.

Dr. Grigg-Damberger contributed to the development of the ABMS Sleep Medicine exam and AASM scoring criteria for polysomnography across age groups. She is an associate editor for both the *Journal of Clinical Sleep Medicine* and the *Journal of Clinical Neurophysiology*, and frequently authors invited reviews on sleep medicine topics. She is a sought-after speaker at national and international conferences and has received multiple teaching honors, including the 2020 AASM Excellence in Education Award. Her recent research includes studies on hypersomnia in adults with epilepsy and glymphatic flow in Parkinson's disease, as well as invited reviews on epilepsy in Alzheimer's disease and the role of sleep in SUDEP.
