Dr. Joyce Lee-Iannotti is the interim director of the Petznick Stroke Center and the founding director of the Sleep Division at Barrow Neurological Institute, where she also serves as a professor of neurology. She holds a joint faculty appointment at the University of Arizona College of Medicine—Phoenix. Board certified in general neurology, vascular neurology, and sleep medicine, she also holds certification in transcranial Doppler ultrasound interpretation from the American Society of Neuroimaging. Her clinical expertise includes neurovascular disease and sleep disorders, with a particular focus on central disorders of hypersomnia (such as narcolepsy), REM sleep behavior disorder, and sleep-wake disturbances related to long COVID.

Dr. Lee-Iannotti is a fellow of both the American Academy of Neurology (AAN), where she chairs the Sleep Section, and the American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM), where she chairs the Sleep Medicine Fellowship Directors Council Steering Committee and serves on multiple committees and task forces. She is also a member of the AASM and AASM Foundation Boards of Directors. She earned her medical degree from the University of South Carolina School of Medicine and completed her neurology residency and sleep medicine fellowship at Cleveland Clinic, followed by a stroke fellowship at Mayo Clinic Arizona. Her research interests include REM sleep behavior disorder, narcolepsy, neuro-COVID syndromes, and the intersection of sleep apnea and stroke, and she remains actively engaged in medical education and advocacy.
